

The Chinese program is designed to prepare students to successfully communicate and interact in Chinese-speaking cultures and communities. Students will develop their language skills, cultural awareness and knowledge through introductory, intermediate, and advanced language courses.

Major Emphasis

Currently the Chinese program does not offer a major.

Major Requirements

To graduate with a Chinese minor, students need to complete the sequence of language courses (Beginner I, Beginner II, Intermediate I, Intermediate II, Advanced I, and Advanced II) and additionally take one course at the 400-level.

Students who begin at the Intermediate II-level need to complete the sequence of language courses (Intermediate II, Advanced I, and Advanced II), and additionally take one 400-level courses and one 500-independent study course.

- Students have opportunities to conduct field research in China paid for by the 4-year implementation of a Luce foundation grant. To qualify, students must take at least two semesters of Chinese language courses. Student projects focus on areas related to environmental issues.
